

Introduction

Going to the beach is a quintessential part of the Australian way of life, however for the 4.4 million Australians living with a disability it is not always possible.

87% of Australians live within 50 kilometres of the coastline and with less than 2% of our 12,000 beaches accessible to people of all abilities we have a long way to go.

When accessing Blue Spaces (bodies of water such as the beach) people with disabilities are more likely to participate socially, be more physically active and have improved mental health and wellbeing.


